

Scholarship Support Changes Life of First-Generation Student

MaKenna Mata moved around a lot throughout her childhood, attending some less-than-desirable schools. And because of the constant uprooting, never really liked school.

Yet despite the challenges, Mata graduated high school early, the first person in her family to do so, making her a first-generation student. By 2018, she found herself enrolled at Tillamook Bay Community College.

"It was honestly a bit of a shock to be in a community that was so involved with each other and at a college that was setting their students up for success," she said. "It was really nice that the teachers and professors (even

when you're not in their class) want to be involved in your life. I 100 percent love the atmosphere at TBCC. I never fault or fail because there's always a support system."

During her time at TBCC, Mata has successfully completed two degrees, an Associate of General Studies and Associate of Science. She was approved for her Oregon Transfer Module, is currently enrolled in TBCC's nursing program, and is a past recipient of the Loren E. Parks Trust Endowed Scholarship. This year, Mata has received the Mario and Alma Pastega Family Scholarship and the DeArmond Scholarship.

"I wanted people to know that students who receive scholarships are grateful," she said. "Education is taken for granted. I don't look like I've gone through the things that I have, and there's a stigma that comes with people like me. There are a lot of issues that come from education in general. But, if there's a goal in life, you have to achieve it. There's a lot of obstacles in life. It's important that you keep challenging yourself."

Mata hopes to become a labor and delivery nurse, specifically to aid expectant mothers during times of need.

2. Name the TBCC Foundation as a beneficiary of your investment account, retirement plan, or life insurance policy.

3. Set up a charitable remainder trust. Use cash, stock, or real estate to fund a charitable gift annuity to receive fixed and guaranteed income during your lifetime and tax benefits upon your death.

4. Lifetime gifting. Sometimes it makes sense for your estate plan to make a charitable gift during your lifetime. Be sure to check with your legal and tax experts before making any significant gifts.

Q: Did TBCC change how you thought about college?



And the most important thing, and what I was looking for the most, was meeting new people, the new connections, new friends, I made a difference

Connecting Donors and Their Recipients

The Tillamook Bay Community College (TBCC) Foundation hosted the annual Mildred Davy Memorial Scholarship and Recognition Event on Friday, October 17, at the Officers' Mess Hall. The event brought together scholarship recipients, Foundation benefactors, and community members who support higher education and student success in Tillamook County.

More than 120 guests attended, including nearly 50 students. One of the event's key goals is to connect TBCC scholarship donors with the students who received awards that year—helping them share stories, build relationships, and celebrate the life-changing impact of scholarship support.

"It's a chance for donors and the community to truly see the impact of scholarships for students," stated Britta Lawrence, Executive Director of Advancement and the Foundation at TBCC. "Hearing their stories of how they were able to afford food, find childcare, and even the idea that someone believes in them enough to give them money for their education. It's something I look forward to every year."

This year, the TBCC Foundation announced it has raised a total of \$5,873,322.79 since its inception. Of that amount, \$1,128,773.86 was raised in 2025 alone. It was a record year for the Foundation and a testament to the community's continued investment in local education.

At its heart, the Mildred Davy Memorial Scholarship and Recognition Event honors the Foundation's scholarship recipients for their achievements,

resilience, and dedication, while celebrating the donors who make their success possible.

Mildred Davy was a beloved member of Tillamook County. For many years, Mildred was the voice of Tillamook as the radio host of "It's a Woman's World," which aired on KTLI, and she was a huge advocate for higher education. In 2002, the first endowed scholarship was established in her name. It started with donations totaling \$25,000 and has now grown to nearly \$200,000, helping 76 TBCC students over the years.

The TBCC Foundation extends heartfelt thanks to everyone who attended and supported this year's scholars. The event was sponsored by TLC, a Division of Fibre Federal Credit Union, the Tillamook County Creamery Association, and JAndy Oyster Co.

What are Emergency Funds?

The intent of the emergency funds program is to provide students who are experiencing an emergency or urgent unexpected expense with funding to help them bridge the gap and stay in school. Whether a student needs help paying rent, getting access to technology, or even purchasing groceries, emergency funds are there to break down those barriers to education.

Facts/Stats:

- \$122,166.00 total scholarship dollars awarded last year from 78 scholarships
- 53% of students reported food insecurity > 53% of students were unsure where their next meal was coming from or if they could afford food. Many have had to choose between food and other expenses like their education, but education shouldn't come at the cost of stability. Hunger should never stand between a student and their education.
- 23% reported experiencing homelessness > 23% of students have experienced being homeless.
- 60% experienced housing insecurity > 60% of students were unsure if they could pay rent, bills, or if they'd have a place to sleep at times.
- \$46,467 of scholarship funds were used for childcare and living expenses last year > When we support parents, we invest in entire families and their futures.
